GPSSII/MAPP Leader Certification





A learning program for Foster Care and adoptive caseworkers, supervisors, homefinders, directors of social services, and agency administrators working in ACS provider agencies.

ABOUT

This learning program helps prospective foster and adoptive parents make informed, mutual decisions with the ACS about whether foster parenting or adopting is right for their family. Learners in the Leader Certification Workshop are prepared to co-lead meetings in the GPS II program as well as to use family consultations and other tools of the program. All certified GPS II leaders are also qualified to conduct Mini-MAPP. Before attending this instructor-led training, learners must complete an online pre-test.

Course content includes:

- Welcome to the Group Preparation and Selection Program
- Where the MAPP Leads: A Foster Care and Adoption Experience
- Losses and Gains: The Need to Be a Loss Expert
- Helping Children with Attachments
- Helping Children Learn to Manage Their Behaviors
- Helping Children with Birth Family Connections
- Gains and Losses: Helping Children Leave Foster Care
- Understanding the Impact of Fostering or Adopting
- Teamwork and Partnerships
- Endings & Beginnings: How to Use the Program

The ten meetings are designed to be offered sequentially once a week along with the other tools of the program, including family self-assessments, individual family consultations and written development plans.

Learners will prepare to deliver the Group Preparation and Selection II of the Model Approach to Partnerships in Parenting (GPSII/MAPP) program for prospective foster/adoptive parents.
