What You Need to Know About Child Support

ABOUT

This eLearning program better prepares direct service staff to have conversations with their assigned families about child support. This program provides learners with an overview of the child support process, guidance on using motivational interviewing techniques in discussions about child support, and an introduction to tools that allow access to individual child support case details. Before attending this eLearning training, learners must complete an online pre-test.

BENEFITS

Learners will:

- Understand the child support process from inception to the court hearing and beyond.
- Become familiar with Snapshot, an online tool that helps service providers assist noncustodial parents to manage their child support cases.
- Be trained how to apply motivational interviewing techniques in conversations about child support with custodial and noncustodial parents.

A one-hour eLearning course



An online post-test
